this unique work explores through personal narratives the overlapping and intermingling of cultures as well as the immense cultural diversity across the world this exploration inevitably questions notions of higher or lower cultures and civilized or uncivilized peoples indeed it questions the very concept of superiority amongst peoples apart from cross cultural encounters this work also discusses how various democratic and non democratic governments and organizations

have attempted to conceal cross cultural influences by inventing superiority purity and authenticity of cultures and civilizations to the detriment of others yet cross culture pollination an ongoing process always reveals itself through the ignored cracks of history the book shows that india is no exception and has been and continues to be porous the numerous examples of cross pollination with algeria indonesia cambodia to mention a few force us to re look cultural constructs and indeed the very meaning of culture

based on documentation of face to face contact experienced by immigrants diplomats overseas students and others cross cultural encounters shows how adjustments to cross cultural contact can be effected the author also points out the growing significance of cross cultural interaction due to increasing legal social economic and technological exchanges and suggests important new areas of research

contextual in approach this text draws on socio economic and political studies as well as histories of religion science literature and popular culture and explores the diverse conflicted history of american art and architecture thematically interrelating the visual arts to other material artifacts and cultural practices the text examines how artists and architects produced artwork that visually expressed various social and political values publisher s website

setting up cultural encounters is a widespread intervention strategy employed to diffuse conflicts and manage difficulties related to diversity these organised cultural encounters bring together people of different backgrounds in order to promote peaceful coexistence and inclusion these transformative aims relate to the participants but are often also expected to spill over into the society community or context addressed by the encounter as a category organised cultural encounters draws together a variety of activities and events such as multicultural festivals dialogue initiatives diversity training and inclusion projects activities that are generally not considered to be of the same kind most of the existing literature on these types of encounters is instrumental and has an overall emphasis on evaluations in terms of outcome or success rate this book goes beyond evaluations and the contributors pose and debate theoretical and methodological questions and analyse the practices and performativities of particular encounters taken together it makes an important contribution to the theorisation and analysis of intercultural relations and negotiations this book was originally published as a special issue of the journal of intercultural studies

The results should help to reach an understanding and improvement of communication in these situations knowing that communication is one of the most vital

manager's tasks that takes up between 50 and 90 of a manager's time therefore communication that is not disturbed by cultural misunderstandings is essential for the success of any cross cultural enterprise the first main part examines if there are any differences in the way that these nations approach business especially negotiations and if so the disclosed differences will be laid down and explained with an outlook on the cultural roots of these specific issues of behaviour the main focus rests on Germany as a starting point with which the other cultures will be compared different approaches regarding research findings in the cultural field will be presented and applied to the particularities found in the named nations in the second main part mediation will be scrutinized as a possible tool to facilitate cross cultural negotiations it will be questioned whether mediation may be helpful in a cross cultural context which aspects of mediation can help to overcome the special barrier culture in negotiations working methods and which factors may have to be considered with special care in such a situation this will be done with a focus on the cultural dimensions presented in the first part in a next step cultural training will be briefly presented as a human resources tool that may help to prepare for a temporary stay abroad and for cooperation with members of other cultures for this different training methods will be explained in a conclusion the findings of this paper will be summarised specific advice for negotiations with the cultures under scrutiny will be given and a general checklist for cross cultural negotiations will be presented it must be stressed that this paper will not be an empirical work but concentrate on the analysis of the existing literature and partly resort to interviews carried out by the author in total this work should be an inducement for further research on the influence of culture on negotiations within Europe and the advantages that mediation can offer for cross cultural encounters
