in this literary novel set in nineteenth century texas a tejana lesbian cowgirl embarks on an adventure after the fall of the alamo micaela campos witnesses the violence against mexicans african americans and indigenous peoples after the infamous battles of the alamo and of san jacinto both in 1836 resisting an easy opposition between good versus evil and brown versus white

acclaimed historians randy roberts and james olson use a wealth of archival sources including the diary of josé enrique de la peña to retell the story of the alamo for a new generation of americans in late february and early march of 1836 the mexican army commanded by general antonio lópez de santa anna besieged a small force of anglo and tejano rebels at a mission known as the alamo the defenders faced a dire predicament lacking vital information about the events unfolding beyond the mission s walls they did not have much of an understanding of santa anna or of his government in mexico city they sent out contradictory messages they received contradictory communications they moved blindly and planned in the dark and in the dark early
