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seeks to bring present day philosophy principles into the history of aesthetics before the publication of aesthetics from classical greece to the present there were three histories of aesthetics in english bosanquet s pioneering work the second part of croce s aesthetic in the ainsle translation and the comprehensive volume by gilbert and kuhn while each of these is interesting in its own ways and together they cover a good deal of ground none of them is very new thus none could take advantage of recent work on many important philosophers and periods and bring into a consideration of the past the best concepts and principles that have been developed by present day philosophy

this volume is a fascinating introduction to the core themes and basic methods of aesthetics and the philosophy of art providing an analytic and historical treatment of the issues and including many illustrative examples to both motivate and reinforce theoretical discussion an introduction to aesthetics d is the ideal course book for the philosophical novice it includes an appendix containing the texts referred to in the book a comprehensive glossary and further reading suggestions to help the student reader develop a deeper comprehension of the field

the object of this book is to determine for the reader if possible the qualities causing excellence in the higher arts and to increase his appreciation of them the phenomena of the arts of the highest class have been traced to their sources in material nature and in the human mind the different arts have been shown to be developed by exactly similar methods and these methods have been shown to characterize the entire work of artistic imagination from the formulation of physical concepts to that of their most physical expressions in rhythm proportion and harmony conjointly with these subjects the effects of all the arts together upon everything that makes for culture and for humanity have been considered in themselves as well as in their relations to religion and to science to both of which art is somewhat allied and yet in such ways as to make it important that the three should be differentiated preface

first published in 1983 aesthetics and the sociology of art provides a lucid account of two divergent tendencies in the study of aesthetics at the one extreme traditional aestheticians have assumed that art and literature are wholly independent following only the laws and inspirations of artists and artistic movements and that the question of aesthetic value is accordingly unproblematic at the other extreme some sociologists have treated works of art as no more than manifestations of the socio economic circumstances which produce them arguing that aesthetic value is therefore entirely relative matter janet wolff shows how both the extreme positions are untenable and argues convincingly that we must accept that the conceptions and criteria of aesthetic value are socially constructed and inevitably ideological while stopping short of the reductionist alternative which fails to recognise the irreducible questions of pleasure and of aesthetic discourse this book provides an invaluably clear guide both to old debates and to otherwise obscure modern controversies which will be welcomed both by students and scholars in the sociology of art in aesthetics in art history and in literary criticism

volume i the development of aesthetics was one of the great accomplishments of eighteenth century philosophy as the classical conception of aesthetic experience as a form of knowledge came under pressure from increasing recognition of the emotional impact of art and from increasing emphasis on the value of freedom in the moral and political thought of the century this opening volume of a history of modern aesthetics recounts how philosophers in britain france and germany developed these new approaches and searched for ways to combine them
