postmodern art emerged in the late 1960s following a time period when art had been defined by superstars like pablo picasso and salvador dalí rejecting the idea of art being exclusive to professionals artists who emerged during the postmodern era believed anyone could be an artist and anything could be art through exciting main text featuring annotated quotes from experts detailed sidebars and examples of postmodern art readers explore how the foundations of art were challenged by postmodern artists such as andy warhol and barbara kruger and also how their work still impacts today s art world

the postmodern arts provides essential material and invaluable guidance for students of modern literature and culture

art history after the sixties examines the 1960s and 1970s as a watershed era in our current understanding of art and its historiography pamela lee asks how why and at what cost art critics of that generation shifted their attention away from aesthetics to focus pimarily on the social and political nature of art most notably in the writings appearing in the influential journal october she

also looks closely at the major artists of that era from robert smithson most well known for his provocative earthwork spiral jetty to andy warhol art history after the sixties is the fifth volume in theories of modernism and postmodernism in the visual arts james elkins s series of short books on the theories of modernism written by leading art historians on twentieth century art and art criticism the book will feature a critical introduction by a fellow art historian placing the book in conversation with the previous books in the series

an introduction to postmodern art including the roots of postmodernism

postmodernism in the visual arts is not just another ism it emerged in the 1960s as a transformation of artistic creativity inspired by duchamp s idea that the artwork does not have to be physically made by its creator products of mass culture and technology can be used just as well as traditional media this idea became influential because of a widespread naturalization of technology where technology becomes something lived in as well as used postmodern art embodies this attitude to explain why paul crowther investigates topics such as eclecticism the sublime deconstruction in art and philosophy and paolozzi s wittgenstein inspired works

the essays collected here present a cross section of the debates on postmodernism being waged in philosophy and the arts some contributors raise general questions about postmodernism for example its language and its politics others offer specific readings of architecture painting literature theatre photography film and television

foregrounding a strategy of experimental techniques which neustadt call con fusing signs the book explores critical and political dimensions of contemporary spanish american artistic practices that are often explained away in the vague name of postmodern fragmentation con fusing signs explores the techniques consequences and purposes for this type of fragmentation this study reassesses the much discussed crisis of representation through an analysis of the complexity of political critique in areas as diverse and related as postmodernity military dictatorship and postcolonialism this book explores the manner in which multimedia artists diamela eltit alejandro jodorowsky and guillermo g mez pe a articulate political critiques through textual con fusion while paradoxically underscoring their inability to get outside of discourse

art in the postmodern era examines how artists and intellectuals from central and eastern europe got involved in debating postmodernism and how this postmodern in turn impacted the way of thinking about art in central europe the book starts with a brief survey of 20th century art and then focuses on the neo avant garde and the birth of postmodern art with its democratization and subsequent shift towards a post artistic epoch when anything can become art the book also raises an important issue concerning art in the time of globalization series development in humanities vol 3

nineteen forty five marked a historical moment in the figurative arts with new trends related to changes in the cultural climate caused in large part by the war this book presents an in depth overview of the arts from the postwar period in europe and the united states to today from analysis of the pictorial languages of the leading masters of the second half of the 20th century including the avant gardes of the 1950s to consideration of the trends that have inaugurated the third millennium breaking the traditional borders between painting and sculpture in the immediate postwar period a situation strongly marked by the tragedies of war europe and the united states entered a period in art marked by upheavals and the creations of highly original personalities the international art scene came to be populated by generations of anti conventional underground artists who explored new territories in artistic communication these artists pushed past the social realism and abstract art of preceding decades to adopt daring new expressive languages that swept over the traditional borders between painting and sculpture from postwar existential tension came art informel along with abstract expressionism leading to the definitive break with tradition there are then lucio fontana s poetics mark rothko s use of color andy warhol s serial images and pop art leading to the most recent developments in the postmodern avant gardes contemporary art has become the site of cultural exchanges during our time with global materials and contexts external space has itself become part of art leading to such extremes as land art postmodern art with more than 400 color images explores the currents themes and names that are part of the artistic heritage of today from art informel to new dada to body and video art its sixteen chapters present painters sculptors photographers and architects with their most important works many of them results of the close identification between art and life

this book brings together the work of international art therapists with diverse experiences and perspectives they share however a common postmodern belief that art is a unique way of

expressing the human condition and that art therapy should not be a diagnostic tool but a collaborative healing process between the therapist and the client

in this book ale debeljak offers a refreshing alternative to postmodernists such as baudrillard who declare the death of art conceived as yet another source of rootless circulating fictions inspired by the melancholy critical theory of adorno and bejamin debeljak shows that with the dawning of modernity art was made autonomous art production was effectively emancipated from the exigencies of everyday life and its guiding ideal of purposive rationality the deterioration of bourgeois liberal individualism into the narcissism of modern mass society accompanied the decomposition of art into simplified mass art and commercialized kitsch today argues debeljak postmodern art is subjected to infinite reproducibility total integration into mass society and political resignation it no longer represents an alternative reality the postmodern institution of art thus cannot be simply cured of modern structures and assumptions but is instead fated to a continuous and painful relationship with modernity from back cover

when dada burst onto the european stage in 1916 it shocked and scandalized the public of its day with art forms ideas and attitudes which were so revolutionary that it is only in recent decades that they have begun to find recognition within the broad cultural movement known as postmodernism in fact many postmodern artistic and intellectual tendencies can be seen to have descended via an underground tradition from the experiments of the dadaists earlier this century yet the existence of this close link has been largely neglected by scholars this book for the first time examines in depth the link between modernism and postmodernism and demonstrates the extensive similarities as well as the few crucial differences between the ideas and art of the dadaists on the one hand and those of contemporary postmodern thinkers and artists on the other although they did not have

access to postmodern terminology it is clear that many dadaists were essentially attempting to escape constrictive enlightenment and modernist structures in order to create a proto postmodern space of difference otherness and flux their successes failures and compromises in this respect are very illustrative for anyone interested in the progress of our own intellectual and artistic culture in its wavering between modern and postmodern this book offers a much needed historical perspective and solid basis for the on going debate on postmodernism

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
