many studies of teacher motivation have been conducted in different contexts over time however until fairly recently there has not been a reliable measure available to allow comparisons across samples and settings this has resulted in an abundance of findings which cannot be directly compared or synthesised the fit choice instrument offers the opportunity to examine motivations across settings the various studies in this book suggest that people who choose teaching as a career are motivated by a complex interaction of factors embedded within communities and cultural expectations but seem generally to embrace a desire to undertake meaningful work that makes for a better society unlike some careers where rewards are in the form of salary and status by and large these factors are not strong drivers for people who want to become teachers they want to work with children and adolescents and believe they have the ability to teach

in response to the covid 19 pandemic many educational institutions implemented social distancing interventions such as initiating closure developing plans for employees to work remotely and transitioning teaching and learning from face to face classrooms to online environments the abrupt switch to online teaching and learning for the most part has been a massive change for administration faculty and students at traditional brick and mortar universities and colleges as concerns regarding the pedagogical soundness of this mode of delivery remain among some stakeholders not only that but the switch has also revealed the inequities in the system when it comes to the types of students universities serve it is important as institutions move forward with online instruction that consideration be made about all students and what policies and strategies need to be put into place to help support and meet the needs of all constituents now

or when unprecedented situations arise the only way this can be done is by documenting the experiences through the eyes of faculty who were at the frontline of providing instruction and advising services to students the handbook of research on inequities in online education during global crises brings to light the struggles faculty and students faced as they were required to switch to online education during the global covid 19 health crisis this crisis has revealed inequities in the educational system as well as the specific effects of inequities when it comes to learning online and the chapters in this book provide information to help institutions be better prepared for online education or remote learning in the future while highlighting topics such as new educational trends remote instruction diversity in education and teaching and learning in a pandemic this book is ideal for in service and preservice teachers administrators teacher educators practitioners stakeholders researchers academicians and students interested in the inequalities within the educational systems and the new policies and strategies put in place with online education to combat these issues and support the needs of all diverse student populations
